STATION ONE

WONDERING, WAITING, SEEKING


INTRO: Greeted by a 'Magi' Actor.

SET: A large trunk with a wiseman sitting on it reading a scroll. Inside the trunk — three treasures (gold, frankincense and myrrh with information about each item on the object: gold, for royalty on earth; frankincense, a symbol of deity; and myrrh, embalming oil foretelling suffering and sacrifice).

MAGI: (sitting on trunk looking at a scroll) Oh hello ... (looking up from scroll) Are you searching too? Have you seen any signs in the night sky? We have been waiting for generations, watching for signs and reading the prophets. I know that there is a Savior coming into the world. When I see the sign, I will get this caravan on the road. We are gathering gifts for the one true King. Do you want to see my treasures? (opens chest and audience reads out loud the symbolism of each gift) ...

MAGI: When we see the star, we will confirm where to go and find the palace of this new King ... Hmmm ... But sometimes I wonder if it will ever happen ... Do you think God has forgotten us? That doesn't seem possible. To be honest, this journey will be a big leap of faith. But, what is faith – yes, it is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see. Let's read together some of my story (see verses on page 4):

STATION TWO

TIRED, WEAK AND AFRAID

SET: A stump or stool for Mary to sit on.

MARY: (speaking to Joseph) I'm tired, cold and frightened. I need to rest.

JOSEPH: Let's rest here. (Looks over at the audience) Would you like to hear our story?

MARY: I don't want to complain, it has just been so hard these last few months.

JOSEPH: It all started when I found out that Mary was pregnant. It didn't add up. I was going to break the engagement, but that's when things got really interesting. An angel appeared to me. I was so shocked that I was told to marry her. You see, the angel told me this baby was the Son of God. He was to be the Savior of the world. By faith, I took a leap and here we are today (smiling at Mary and audience).

MARY: An angel had already appeared to me and I was in on the plan. At first, I was confused, but then I had faith. I was so happy. I sang praises to God for all that he had done for me and my people. But then things got hard, we had to leave Nazareth and travel to Bethlehem. As you can see, I am weak, tired and pregnant.

JOSEPH: We weren't sure which way to go. It is such a long journey and we need to find homes along the way to stay in. We always avoid going through Samaria — they are an unclean and an unfaithful people. But to bypass it means more uncertainty and risk with wild animals or robbers along the way.

MARY: There are so many people on this road and they all seem to move faster than us. I am afraid this baby will be born right here in the middle of the road or in some dirty little cave surrounded by animals being prepared for the sacrifices. How will we raise this God/man child? What if he gets lost? What if he falls in with sinners or worse still — tax collectors!

JOSEPH: Is this the plan God has for us? I really need to lean on faith and His strength and protection on this journey. To be honest, this is a big step of faith, but as they say, faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance of what we do not see.

O LITTLE TOWN OF BETHLEHEM


Verse One

STATION THREE

FALLEN, FORGOTTEN, ALONE

SET: Shepherds, goats, some small logs/stools to sit on.

SHEPHERD 1: (sneering) I see you looking at us (to the audience). Yes, we are shepherds. There was a time when shepherds were the leaders of faith — the great forefathers of the tribes. Now you look at us and see us as fallen to low places, all but forgotten.

SHEPHERD 2: That's right. We tend these goats for you to uphold the Law and offer them as sacrifices. We will not be in the temple with you worshipping your legalistic god.

SHEPHERD 1: We will be here stuck in this rut, taking care of what needs to get done. We are alone and forgotten on this path.

SHEPHERD 3: (sincerely, optimistically) They say God is gracious and his love is eternal ...

SHEPHERD 1: Hmph ... maybe if He would come down here and see what it is like to live here — to toil and suffer — then we would find out what love really means.

SHEPHERD 4: (pitying) So cynical, so alone.

SHEPHERD 5: (challenging) Well, Joshua, what would it take to move you back on this path toward God, away from darkness?

ANGEL 2: (to audience) He is calling to you and inviting you to walk alongside Him.

ANGEL 1: (to audience) How is He calling you to worship?


ANGEL 3: Do you see the God of grace? How is He calling to live?

STATION FOUR

LIGHT, LOVE AND GRACE

SET: The Nativity (use the wooden cut outs set up and an angel to interpret).

ANGEL 1: Welcome! The Savior has come.

ANGEL 2: Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace and good will to men.

ANGEL 3: When these seekers saw Jesus, their faith was restored and renewed. There was joy and celebration.

ANGEL 1: Celebrate with me now as we remember the birth of Jesus (presents flocking activity).

ANGEL 2: Joy comes on the path as well. That was fun.

ANGEL 3: I am wondering though, do you think this is the end or the beginning of the journey?

Will you join me in reading the scriptures? (directs audience or actors to take turns reading the verses):
